2019 Medical Camp

In January 2019, our organization Grandmothers Beyond Borders partnered with another humanitarian group, Hope Without Borders to embark on a day-long medical camp offering medicinal and personal care services to grandmothers and their grandchildren in Kabimbiri Village, a rural district approximately 55 km east of the Ugandan capital of Kampala.

In preparation for their maiden trip to Uganda, <u>Hope Without</u> <u>Borders</u> came from the United States with an assembly of over two dozen collegiate scholars and medical professionals ready to offer medical assistance free of charge to over 300 Grandmothers.

We also partnered with a variety of local organizations who offer support to these Grandmothers routinely including:

- Kangulumira Clinic Physician Assistants, and Nurses
- Nagalalama Hospital Medical Doctors, Nurses & Physician Assistants
- Kabimbiri Clinic Nurse
- Kisubi University Lab Technicians to do on-site blood work and rapid result testing.


MEDICAL CAMP RESULTS:

- 350 Grandmothers received medical attention
- Through our partner, <u>Hope Without Borders</u>' program called "The Elephant Project" over 60 granddaughters were trained and received personal hygiene items including reusable sanitary napkins.
- <u>Hope Without Borders</u>' program "The Blue Lion" also distributed personal hygiene products to 20 grandsons.
- Our partners, <u>Hope Without Borders</u> distributed water purifiers to attendees which provide clean drinking water to Grandmothers and their families in rural areas
- With the aid of our partners <u>Hope Without Borders</u>, we were able to distribute over 300 reading books to the grandchildren of the attendees.
- <u>Hope Without Borders</u> also worked with local pharmacists to allocate prescriptions for the elderly attendees.
